CLAY LAKE PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

The second phase of the pedestrian improvement works around Breach Road and Clay Lake will begin week commencing 2nd March 2020. The works are anticipated to last for approximately 2 weeks.

In accordance with the Consultation drawing previously issued, the works will include:

- •Installation of a Vehicle Activated Sign on the approach to the new uncontrolled pedestrian crossing point near Broad Lane
- •Installation of a Speed Indication Device on the approach to Brown Edge village from Clay Lake
- •Removal of existing 40mph roundel signage and posts along Breach Road/Clay Lake between Greenfield Avenue and Stoney Lane.
- •Install new road markings adjacent to newly installed Pedestrian Crossing warning signs on the approach to the recently constructed uncontrolled crossing point near Broad Lane.

Following completion of the signage works, the new 30mph speed limit will be enforceable from 16th March 2020.

GRASS VERGES

The Parish Council is in discussions with County Highways about developing a section of the A53 grass verge into a wild flower meadow. The Council intend to follow the Plantlife programme which is aimed at encouraging native species of wild flowers which will attract birds and insects. If the project cannot go ahead this year then plans will be put in place for 2021.

176th WELL DRESSING NEWS

Endon Well Dressing will be held on 23rd, 24th and 25th, May Bank Holiday Weekend.

If you would like to help with the preparations for this year's event then come along to the Well Dressing Field on Sat 16th May at 2pm, all help gratefully received. Road closures will be in place in the village over the

weekend as follows: Brook Lane from junction with Hallwater; Gratton Lane from junction with Holehouse Lane and The Village from junction with A53. The closure will run from 11am each day until 7pm Sat and Mon and 8pm on Sun.

PAPER RECYCLING CHANGES

From Monday 30th March residents will no longer need to separate their paper, instead they can place it into their grey wheelie bin for recycling alongside their cardboard, glass, cans and plastics. If your grey bin is too small, then residents can apply for a larger 240-litre bin. Households will be receiving notification of this change in early March. As a result of this paper recycling bags will no longer be replaced. There will be no changes to the other refuse containers, including the brown bin for food and garden waste and the blue-lidded bin for general rubbish.

SMDC currently has the 30th best recycling performance out of 345 local authorities nationally and hopes that this change will help to increase overall recycling rates as well as generating significant savings.
