CLAY LAKE SPEEDING

Residents of Clay Lake are still concerned, despite the traffic calming measures, at the amount of traffic still exceeding the 30mph restrictions. To enable all residents to be part of a consultation process they will shortly be asked to share their views by emailing either Geoff Smith or Philip Shemilt, details will be on the request form. Endon High School will continue to be involved in this consultation as part of their safer routes to school policy. Hopefully there will be a good response to this request and will show an accurate picture of exactly what residents' thoughts are regarding the problems in trying to calm traffic.

The resulting outcome will be shared at a later date.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

In response to extremely positive feedback last year the Parish Council will again host a Remembrance Sunday commemoration on Nov 14th at the Station Road Memorial Park. The Park was gifted to the Parish Council in 1921 as a community facility to honour the fallen of WW1. The ceremony will commence at 10.30am with a similar format to last year with the addition that we are now able to congregate on the field and a PA system will relay the proceedings. The ceremony will follow British Legion guidelines in that it is non religious and is therefore accessible to everyone, with or without faith. There will be appropriate readings and music with a bugler sounding the Last Post followed by two minutes silence at 11 o'clock. For those who wish to place tributes, poppies and wreaths at the War Memorial in St Luke's churchyard, a short ceremony will be held there at approximately 11.30am.

For those wishing to attend a religious ceremony St Luke's Church will be holding a Remembrance Service at 10.45am and Endon Methodist Church will hold their usual 10am service.

PARISH GRANTS 2021/22

Financial Grants are available to organisations, in the parish, who can demonstrate an extra need for funds which will directly benefit the community. Awards from £50 to £500 will be made (grants above this amount will be considered by the council on an individual basis). Application forms are available from the Parish Office in Station Road, open on Mondays and Tuesdays, or can be posted or emailed to you (ring 01782 503918, email: clerkatendon9@gmail.com) and can be found on the Parish Council's Web site. **These need to be submitted before the end of November 2021.** Decisions on grant aid will be taken at the December council meeting and successful applicants will be asked to attend the Annual Parish Meeting in April, to inform both the Council and parishioners how their money has been used.

COMMUNITY CHOIR

Soon we will start practising Christmas songs and carols, and preparing for a massed choir event in Lichfield Cathedral in the Spring, so now is a great time to join us. HILLSWOOD PLAYING FIELD

Now that the Station Road play area has been revamped the PC is turning its attention to Hillswood.

A survey has been conducted to ascertain what equipment would be desirable and inviting suggestions for other improvements. Once the results have been analysed the PC will then carry out a costing exercise and look at means of raising finance via grants.

210 TREES

In spring the Woodland Trust announced that they were receiving orders for trees to be delivered for the autumn planting season. The Parish Council immediately placed a request for a mixed variety delivery of 105 trees to be planted in Queen's Jubilee, 2022. On the sad passing of the Duke of Edinburgh it was decided to double the order and dedicate 100 trees to the Prince Philip, honouring his work as a conservationist. These trees are free to organisations as long as the Trust is confident that they are appropriate to the proposed site, planted correctly and well maintained. We are pleased to announce that 210 trees of mixed variety and year round colour will be delivered to us between November 1st and November 10th and will be planted on Council land as living tributes.



VANDALISM

Sadly the bench at Stockton Brook has again been vandalised. The last time this happened it was repaired by Andrew Stretch and he is now attempting to repeat the excellent job he did previously. When residents wish to report damage caused by vandalism it should be reported to the police and also to the Parish Clerk who will then be able to instigate remedial action straightaway. Reporting damage to other sources will delay action being taken.



VILLAGE HALL

During the various lockdowns the hall has purchased some new chairs and tables which are more easily sanitised and introduced a new digital locking system which does not require a key.

Plans have been drawn up for a refurbishment of the toilet area which is anticipated to be completed in the new year. A CCTV system will be installed shortly to cover the outside of the building and it is hoped that this will prevent the acts of vandalism which occur.

If you are using the hall and you have a car please park responsibly and be considerate of the local residents.
